**KRISTOFFER RAGNSTAM**

This breakout disc from Swedish singer-songwriter Kristoffer Ragnstam demands attention. Make no mistake: this isn't just a guy crooning with a guitar. *Sweet Bills* is full of strikingly intricate compositions, featuring a smorgasbord of instruments, flushed out over many months in various recording studios with the help of skilled musicians and engineers (Ragnstam is a well-versed engineer himself). The Beck comparisons are valid, and so are slight likenesses to Phoenix, The Sea And Cake, and Sondre Lerche. But Ragnstam has his own sound, one that's diverse and somewhat wandering at times—and there's continuity in that eclectic nature, which gives the album definitive flavor.—M.F.

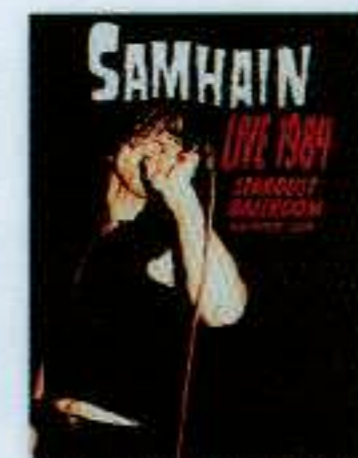
**THE DAWN OF THE STONE AGE**
