***Jesus Christ Vampire Hunter***

Buffy's got nothing on Our Lord, the vampire slayer. With the help of red-leather clad Mary Magnum and Mexican wrestler superhero El Santo, Jesus (Phil Caracas) makes Ontario the site of the Second Coming and takes on a plague of vampires who walk in the sunlight and prey upon defenseless lesbians. A shaggy, silly, and good-natured horror spoof with musical numbers, seventies-style kung-fu action, and a message of love and acceptance (except for, of course, evil vampires), this film earns its cult credentials. It's funny ("Bless the lake, quickly!" shouts Jesus to his priest sidekicks as he busts his martial arts moves on a bevy of vampire goth punks) and more fun that it has a right to be, and the post-dubbed dialogue and library sound-effects only enhance the experience. Someone surely blessed this production. Features commentary by director Lee Gordon Demarbre with writer Ian Driscoll and stars Phil Caracas, Josh Grace, and Jeff Moffet, 39 minutes of cast and crew interviews, an extended dance sequence plus a compilation of outtakes and bloopers, still galleries, the mock *Harry Knuckles* trailer, and the original theatrical trailer.
